

REQUIREMENTS FOR DIABETIC SHOES FOR MEDICARE/MEDICAID

- DIABETIC MANAGEMENT EXAM: Patient must have an in-person/or Telehealth (video + audio) visit with an MD or DO for diabetic management (discuss sugars/medication management/dietary management/A1C, etc.) within 6 months prior to receiving shoes and inserts. In MN & WI, this may not be an NP visit
- FOOT EXAM: Patient must have an in-person/in clinic diabetic foot exam of <u>BOTH</u>
 <u>FEET</u> (if one foot is amputated, that would be noted), within 6 months prior to
 receiving shoes. <u>Telehealth is NOT available</u> for this exam, as it must be an objective
 physical exam. One or more of the *<u>six qualifying foot conditions</u>, <u>below</u>, must be
 recorded in this *objective* bilateral foot exam dictation
 - Foot exam may be completed by the same MD or DO who has conducted the inperson diabetic management visit, **OR**
 - MD or DO treating the diabetes must sign off/agree with the foot exam completed by another clinician, DPM, NP, PA or a different MD, DO
- DM SCP: MD or DO, who manages the patient diabetes, must sign the Statement of Certifying Physician within 3 months prior to patient receiving the shoes AND sign off on the foot exam, if it was executed by another clinician.
- PRESCRIPTION: There has been a prescription issued, by the clinician who completed the foot exam, within the last 3 months for diabetic shoes (and inserts, if needed).

*Six Qualifying Foot Conditions:

- 1. **History of partial or complete amputation of either foot**, recorded in exam notes.
- 2. **History of previous foot ulceration**, recorded in exam notes with dates for history or if current.
- 3. **History of <u>pre-ulcerative</u> callus**, recorded in exam notes with dates for history or if current.
- 4. **Peripheral Neuropathy with evidence of callus formation:

 Neuropathy needs to be noted in foot exam as loss of protective sensation with specific testing; Semmes- Weinstein monofilament (at least 2 of 5 sites documented), tuning fork test for loss of sensation or other physical testing; Callus needs to be noted, if present.
- 5. **Foot deformity**, Examples: bunion, hammertoes, Charcot foot, claw toe, bone spurs, and Pes Planus (flat feet new as of 2021).
- 6. **Poor circulation of either foot**, quantitative recording of pedal pulses in foot/feet, 2 or less, weak, absent, non-palpable

**ALERT: Peripheral Neuropathy, stand alone, is not a qualifying condition for DM shoes/inserts.
